In September New Zealanders will vote on whether the End of Life Choice (EOLC) Act should come into force in a binding referendum. If more than 50% of voters choose YES, this will mean some significant changes occur in the New Zealand health system to allow some New Zealanders with terminal illnesses an option of assisted dying.

This webinar aims to educate New Zealand Health Professionals about what the EOLC Act is, what it could mean for medical practice and our patients, and what we may wish to consider when voting.
